AOR	A development weekend was held at Werribee in August with 26 participants. State Championships went well despite the weather – 150 riders entered comprising 120 horses and 30 ponies. There were entries in all classes up to Grand Prix, with Novice horse the biggest class with 38 entries (3 waitlisted). Separate pony classes were run from Prelim to Medium. Leaderboard awards and trophies were presented at the Annual Awards night dinner. A Silent Auction was run in conjunction with Annual Awards to raise funds for future squad weekends which had a great result and reward for the hard work by the Committee to get donations. Squad weekend is scheduled for 21/22 October and will be held at Randall Park, Warragul.
