Para-Equestrian: Prize money paid to overall placegetters (Combined results of FEI team & individual competitions). Prize money will be based on the number of entries. 5 entries or more, prize money or prizes to 3rd place, 4 entries prize money or prizes to 2nd place, less that 4 entries per grade, prize money or prizes for 1st place only. Ribbons to 3rd place. Refer page 10 for more information.

Special National Awards and Trophies

The Dietmar Specht Memorial Trophy: This perpetual trophy donated by the Horse Magazine is designed to encourage talented young dressage riders. Riders must be under 30 years of age on the first day of the Australian Championships. The winner is chosen from the best two placings of the nominated combination in official competitions from Elementary to Grand Prix including Freestyles and Grand Prix Special. The winner will hold the Perpetual trophy for one year. Riders are to nominate on the entry form if they wish to nominate for this award. No entry fee is required. A rider may enter one horse. In the case of equality, the horses or pony with the highest aggregate score is the winner.

The Rod Barker Memorial Trophy: Presented by the Horse Magazine for the highest percentage score gained during the Australian Championships, excluding Freestyles.

The Crown Law Memorial Trophy: Presented by Mrs Erica Taylor to the winner of the Grand Prix Special. This trophy will be awarded as a perpetual trophy and will remain the property of Equestrian Australia.

EA Australian Grand Prix Champion: The Australian Grand Prix Champion is the combination that achieves the best two scores in the (a) Grand Prix's and Grand Prix Freestyle or (b) the Grand Prix and the Grand Prix Special (using the Championship point score system). A rug will be presented by Equestrian Australia. In the case of equality, the highest Grand Prix score will determine the Champion. Only Australian Riders are eligible.

DETAIL OF COMPETITIONS

Entries and the competition program may be limited and revised at the discretion of the Organising Committee.

COMPETITIONS 1 – 16 (EA Novice to Advanced)

- Maximum number of entries per competition: 35 horses or 35 ponies
- Champions to be decided on point system of both competition at each level. Refer Rule 10.11 EA Dressage Rule Book.
- Eligibility: Refer page 8 & 9

COMPETITIONS 17 EA Advanced Freestyle

Open to 12-15 combination who have qualified in the Advanced competitions (based on the championship point score system. Entry fee will be refunded to the combination that do not qualify for the freestyle.

COMPETITIONS 18/19, 20/21, 28/29 (FEI Prix St Georges 2022, Intermediate I 2022, Intermediate II 2022)

- Limited on entry numbers: 30-35 horses (*OC will consider allowing a maximum of 35 entries depending on entries and time constraints.
- Eligibility: Refer page 8 & 9

COMPETITIONS 22: FEI Intermediate Freestyle to Music (2022)

Open to combination who have qualified/been accepted for the intermediate I Championship. The numbers of entries will be limited to a maximum of 15. Participation will be determined by performances gained in the Intermediate I Championship and combinations must receive a minimum score of 60% in the Intermediate I. Entry fees will be refunded to the combinations that do not qualify for the Freestyle.

COMPETITIONS 23,24, 25 & 24, 25, 26: FEI Intermediate A and B (2022)

- Champion to be decided on point system of both competitions. Rule 10.11
- Eligibility: Refer page 6

COMPETITIONS 30/31 FEI CDN Grand Prix (2022)

- Limit on entry numbers: 30-35 horses (*the OC will consider allowing a maximum of 35 entries depending on entries and time constraints).
- Eligibility: Page 8 & 9

COMPETITION 32: FEI CDN Grand Prix Freestyle (2022)

- Eligibility: Refer to page 8 for entry details.
- The top 15 place getters in the Grand Prix (including ponies) are eligible to start in the Freestyle; (however combinations must earn a minimum score of 58%, in the qualifying Grand Prix competition.

COMPETITION 33/34/35: FEI U-25 competitions: Inter II-U25 (2022), Grand Prix-U25 (2022), GP Freestyle (2022)

Open to riders from beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year they reach the age of 25. Horse must be at least 8 years of age. Refer pages 6 and 10 for entry details. Competitors must gain a minimum of 60% in the U-25 Grand Prix to be eligible for the U-25 Freestyle competition.

COMPETITION 36/37/38: FEI Young Rider competitions: Team (2022), Individual (2022), Freestyle (2022).

Open to riders from beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end calendar year they reach the age of 21. Horses must be at least 7 years of age. Refer page 6 and 10 for entry details. Competitors must gain a minimum of 60% in the individual competition to qualify for the Young Rider Freestyle.

COMPETITION 39/40/41 FEI Junior competitions:

Open to riders from the beginning of the year in which they reach the age of 14 until the end of the calendar year they reach the age of 18. Level is similar to EA Medium.

COMPETITION 42 & 43 FEI CHILDREN CDI-Ch, Preliminary Test A (2022), Team Test (2022)

Open to riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 12 to the end of the calendar year in which they turn 14. The tests are at approximately Novice Level. One Judge sitting at C will mark the technical execution, and two judges sitting together on the side will assess the quality. The Athlete's riding will be assessed through 1) The rider's position and seat, 2) Effectiveness of aids, 3) Precisions, 4) General impression. The percentage from the Quality judges will then be averaged with the score from the Technical Judge.

COMPETITION 46: FEI Grand Prix Special (2022)

The Grand Prix Special is limited to a maximum of 15 combinations that gain at least 60% in the Grand Prix (rule 10.3g). Participation is NOT COMPULSORY for combinations that qualify, Entry fees will be refunded to the combinations that enter and do not qualify.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The 2022 Australian Dressage Championships will be conducted in strict accordance with the current edition (including amendments) of:

- EA Dressage Rules & Official Procedures for Dressage Competition as at the 1/1/22 (and subsequent amendments), EA General Regulations (update 25/2/22)

The EA Dressage Rules and Tests and FEI Dressage Tests may be download form the EA & FEI websites.

 Competitors are advised to be aware of the Rules, refer Section 10 of the current EA Dressage rule book for rules relating to the conduct of Australian Championships. The onus is on riders to know the rules under which they compete.

MEMBERSHIP & HORSE REGISTRATION

- Horses must have a current dressage EA competition license; horses, owners and riders must be registered and financial with EA or, if from overseas, with their National Federation.
- Horses must compete under their full registered name. as must the riders, please enter with the name you have on your membership: eg: Deborah not Deb this is a major problem with the entry check and qualification checks. The Organising Committee reserves the right to abbreviate a horses' name printing purposes. All horses are required to be micro-chipped as per national rules.
- CDIs: Athletes living outside of their country of nationality can participate with permission from their Federation and FEI (Art.6.1 FEI Gen Regs)
- All horses entered for the CDI3* whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official FEI Passport, or FEI recognition Card. Minor events: (CDI/Ch/J/Y/U25) require National Passport approved by the FEI, as a means of identification and to establish ownership. (Gen. Regs. Art. 137). EA National Passport documents are available from the EA National office. Riders must ensure that they have appropriate documents on arrival. Enquiries EA 02 8762 777 or

- FEI Horse and Rider registration: All riders and horses participating in FEI sanctioned events (CDI3*, CDI-U25 Grand Prix, CDI-Y, CDI-J, CDI-Ch) must be registered on the FEI database. Annual Renewal due 1/1/2022 Enquiries to EA 02 8762 7777 or renew online here www.rideahorse.com.au/fei-forms
- CDI3* Grand Prix: Riders may enter both the GP Special and the GP Freestyle or they can opt to ride only one. Horses must qualify with a score of 60% in the GP to be eligible to ride in the GP Special or the GP Freestyle. If more than 15 horses are entered in the GP, riders with 2 horses will be required to choose between the GP F/style & GP Special. (Refer FEI schedule Art. 422.3.2, 3.3 & 3.3.1)
- Sampling procedure for Prohibited substances: Horses may be subject to sampling for Prohibited Substances
 in accordance with EA and FEI Rules.
- FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Program: A fee of (AUD \$27) per horse will be payable for CDI-U25, CDI-Y, CDI-Y, CDI-J, CDI-Ch entries, for CDI3* entries (AUS \$37).
- Anti-Doping: Human testing may take place. Ref FEI/EA Policy on Clean Sport

ENTRIES & ELIGIBILITY

- **Open competitions**: All competitions are for horses exceeding 149 cm with shoes or 148 cm without shoes.
- Pony competitions: Open to ponies who must not exceed 149 cm with shoes or 148 cm without shoes.
 Please note that all ponies must be measured before entering the championships and a current height certificate must be produced with each entry.
- **Rider Age:** For Australian Championship competitions, current EA rules apply (i.e., From the start of the calendar year in which they turn 8 years of age riding ponies & from the start of the calendar year they turn 10 years of age riding horses.
- **FEI-Ch**: Open to riders from beginning of the calendar year they turn 12 to the end of the calendar year they turn 14.
- **FEI-J:** Open to riders from beginning of the calendar year they turn 14 to the end of the calendar year they turn 18.
- **FEI-Y**: Open to riders from beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year they turn 21. Unless otherwise stated.
- **FEI-25**: Horses must be at least 8 years for Grand Prix level. FEI YR Horses Must be at least 7 years of age.
- **Horses may compete** in two (2) consecutive levels only. For example, Nov/Elem; Adv/Prix St Georges, Prix St Georges/ Inter I, Inter B/Inter I, etc. Each horse entered must have the same rider as nominated on the entry form for all competitions. Any changed of rider must be notified to the Event Secretary before the commencement of the event.
- Competitions 1 to 16 EA Levels are open to horses that, at close of entries, have gained less than the following grading points: Novice: less than 40 points at Elementary Level or above; Elementary: less than 40 points at medium level or above; Medium: less than 40 points at Advanced level or above; Advanced: less than 30 points in FEI competitions. Horses entered in all FEI competitions must have performances at the level entered (refer performance). Refer rule 10.2. Up to three performances at the entered level are to be submitted.
- Official Grading: This will be taken as at the date of close of entries. Refer EA dressage rule 4.8.3.2 for grading eligibility.
- **Draw:** Competitions will be limited to a maximum of 35 entries in some competitions depending on entries and time limitations. Acceptance list will be issued along with reserves list before the preliminary Draw. A revised draw may be necessary the day before each competition to allow for withdrawals. The starting order will not alter and a move up system will apply. The onus is on the competitor to confirm/check their start times the day before the competition which will be displayed on the events website and Facebook.
- **Hors Concours**: Rule 10.2 Conditions of entry. One HC result in an Official Competitive Competition may count as a qualification.
- **Entry Fees**: Refer page 3, 4 & 5 of the Schedule.

PERFORMANCE: (OPEN AND PONY CLASSES)

- At least one qualifying score MUST have been obtained by the nominated horse/rider combination (rule 10.2).
- Only one score from a competition with one judge to be accepted per combination (rule 10.2).
- Rider names must be noted when entering online.
- The Organising Committee may request a legible current copy of the horse's Competition licence or a copy of results to **substantiate performance/s**.
- **Performance Eligibility:** All entries for EA competitions (rule EA 10.2), (including pony classes) must be qualified by having gained at least the following performance in an **Official** Competitive competition at the level entering during the 12-month period preceding the closing date entries.
- **Novice** one performance of at least **68%**
- Elementary; one performance of at least 65%
- Medium/Advanced one performance of at least 62% at each level

- **FEI Prix St Georges and Inter I,** one performance of at least **62%** at each respective level (e.g., PSG results needed for PSG, Int I for entry in Int I)
- FEI Inter A or B: one performance of at least 60% in an official Inter A or B competition
- **FEI Intermediate II & Grand Prix** at least **two** performances of at least 60% at each level (e.g., Int II for entry in Int II)
- **FEI-Ch:** One performance of at least **60%** in an official at Novice Level
- **FEI-J:** One performance of at least **60%** in an official at Medium Level
- **FEI-YR:** At least one performance of at least **60%** at PSG or FEI Team or Individual test (CDI-Y) level. (10.18.3 c)
- FEI-U25 At least two performances of 60% in Inter A or Inter. B or Inter II or Grand Prix (10.18.3 b)
- All combinations should submit **their best three performances** in an **Official** Test at the appropriate level, in the 12-month period preceding the closing date for entries, from **7**th **September 2021 to 7**th **September 2022**
- Eventing, Official Participation, Restricted, Freestyle, Young Horse results are not considered.
- Only one HC (Hors Concours) score is permitted to count as a qualifying score at each level entered, rule (10.2).

Ranking (balloting) will be based on the average of the highest percentages of three tests at the particular level, in the 12 months before the close of entries. Riders who submit 3 performances, (only one of which may be HC (Hors Concours) will be considered ahead of those who submit one or two performances. In exceptional circumstances, consideration may be given for a horse that has two high qualifying scores to be ranked above horses with three lower scores on approval of the EADC.

WITHDRAWALS & REFUNDS

Scratching and Refunds: Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless a medical or veterinary certificate is produced **within 24 hours** of the completion of the event. In such cases, 50% of the entry fees will be retained by the O.C. Entry fees will be refunded in full for withdrawals before the closing date, and, for riders on the reserve list who are not offered a start in a competition. The administration fee will **not be refunded.**

- **Refunds** may be considered for withdrawals from competitors travelling long distances who are placed 5th or lower Alissaon the reserve list if the OC is notified no later than **Friday**, **8**th **October**.
- Fees for stables/camp sites **will not be refunded** for competitors who depart earlier than indicated on the entry form.
- Withdrawals (Rule 10.4): No competitor shall withdraw from a competition within 8 hours before the start of the competition without the permission of the Organising Committee. A written statement giving reasons for the withdrawal must be handed to the Event Office prior to the commencement of the competition, horses may be subjected to a veterinary inspection. Penalty for non-compliance max. of \$A200.

OTHER

Please refer EA Dressage Rule 10.6 for other requirements relating to State representation and participation.

OBJECTIONS & APPEALS

Protests and Appeals: Objections must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$100.00. Attention is drawn to Rule 1.5 of EA Dressage Rules (refers to EA General Regulations 163, 165, 166).

SADDLERY & EQUIPMENT

- Horse Identification/bridle numbers (two) must be worn at all times when the horse is outside its stable. The Organising Committee will issue Interstate/Overseas horses that do not have a number with temporary bridle numbers for the duration of the event. If you have a bridle number for your horse, please put the number on the entry form. If a double up of numbers occurs the OC will issue horses with a temporary number for this event.
- National competitions: Whips are not allowed at FEI level competitions at Australian Championships. EA levels (Novice to Advanced) whips are permitted but must not exceed 1.2m in its entirety or 1m for ponies. (Rule section 2).
- A snaffle bridle is compulsory in all EA tests up to and including Elementary level. A snaffle bridle is optional at Medium & above as per EA rules.
- Approved safe helmet must be worn Rule:5.2 As per current EA rules.
- Riders should be aware of their obligations under EA General Regulations 2022 Article 135 regarding Advertising and Publicity on Athletes and Horses (National) or FEI General Regulations, Article 135 -Advertising on Athletes and Horses and Promotion

FREESTYLES

- Only the movements up to and included in the current tests at the level being ridden may be shown. Read section 8 of the EA Dressage rules for further advice in preparing freestyles.
- The format and procedure for supplying music will be notified after the close of entries.
- Equality of scores: if two competitors receive the same final score, the one with the highest marks for artistic presentation is the winner.
- Freestyle Music: Music test times will be allocated on website. All music is to be submitted to this link.

PRESENTATIONS & PRIZE MONEY

Presentations will take place at the end of each day or at the completion of each competition (depending on daily program **and the competition).** A presentation schedule will be available on the website and posted on the notice board in the Event Office at the commencement of the Championships and updated as required. Presentations (including un-mounted) are for riders and owners are welcome.

Participation in the prize-giving ceremony of placed rider/horse combinations is **compulsory**. **Failure to do so will result in combination losing the classification (rosette, prize in kind, prize money).**

Prize money (3.19): In the case of a tie for any of the first three places, the higher total of the collective marks will decide the better placing. Should there still be a tie, the rider score will be the final decider. When there is equality of places from 4th place and below, the competitors are joint equal place getters.

Prize money will be credited to competitors within 10 working days after the event via **Electronic Funds Transfer**. Please ensure you enter the correct bank details on the entry form.

Format for all mounted presentations: 4th to last placed horses (i.e., those receiving sashes/rosettes) will do a lap of honour and be introduced by the commentator. These horses will then leave the arena. Following this, the horses placed 1st to 3rd will take part in the formal presentation and will line up in normal fashion for the presentation by the Sponsor and Member of the Ground Jury. Only **white** bandages are allowed

ACCREDITATION & TICKETING

Accreditation/Ticketing: Will be allocated as follows: One pass per rider, one pass per groom, one pass for the registered EA horse owner (where different to the rider). This entitles the bearer to free admittance to the venue and to all sessions except separate ticketed events. Accreditation (in the form of wrist bands) will be issued at the venue to those eligible.

There will be tight control of wrist bands issued at this event. One groom per horse applies for the duration of the event and no swapping permitted.

Riders who scratch before the start of the event are not entitled to any competitor privileges or passes.

OTHER/GENERAL INFORMATION

- Callers: No test may be commanded.
- Dogs Wildlife Sanctuary is located at Boneo Park so dogs must be always on a leash. No dangerous dogs please.
- Speed limits must be always adhered to.
- Electric Scooters: Must be ridden responsibly: Children under 18year MUST wear safely Helmet
- Only designated parking areas can be used.
- Horses are not to be tied up to floats or trucks unless using twine and are supervised
- Alcohol must not be consumed by anyone subsequently riding
- Smoking is prohibited in the stable area
- Children under 14 years must be under strict supervision, at all times
- Horses must be led along laneways not the main drive
- Cars and vehicles are not allowed on horse laneways.
- Please be aware that all fences are electric.

Riders' Welcome: A casual Welcome will be held for all accredited riders, their partners, owners and grooms on Thursday 13th October 2022

Riders' Forum: A Riders' Forum will be held at the event. Details will be confirmed. All riders are encouraged to attend.

The serving of alcohol to underage persons is not permitted. Competitors have a responsibility to ensure that grooms or family members under their care are supervised.

Indemnity: Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted, undertake to indemnify the Committee against all claims, losses, suits, and damages made against or suffered by the Committee by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any riders, trainers or attendants whilst they are attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse, and agree that any act or omission on the part of such riders or attendants found in any action against the Committee to be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity. Riders are required to electronically sign the Declaration form included in the entry section. **Indemnity:** Neither the Organising Committee (CPH Pty Ltd), Equestrian Australia, Boneo Park, Department of Parks Victoria, accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, grooms, owners, ground spectators or any other person or property whatsoever. All competitors, in entering, undertake to accept this regulation.

Medication Control: Horses: This event is conducted with EA Medical policy and FEI Anti-Doping Controlled Medication regulation

Insurances: The OC (CPH) has public liability insurance through Affinity Insurance, competitors have some personal accident and public liability insurance as part of their membership of Equestrian Australia.

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

All riders are advised to belong to a private health fund.

WELFARE OF THE HORSE – FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to always acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

A full copy of this code of conduct is available on the FEI Website and included in the FEI Dressage Rules.

EA General Codes of Conduct: EA Members should be aware of the EA Codes of Conduct for competitors, officials and EA Members. Refer the EA web site for more information www.equestrian.org.au

Boneo Park Code of Conduct: The Boneo Park Equestrian Centre is an exclusive, private facility and in the interests of ensuring the enjoyment and safety of all users the following code of conduct applies.
