3	MANAGEMENT AND FINANCE REPORTS					
3.1	Annual Jumping Victoria Report 2020	Clint Rose (CR) presented the Jumping Victoria report for the year ended 30 June 2020.				
3.1.1	Officials Training and Development	The JV strategic review conducted May 2019 highlighted the lack of available officials for events. The need for more training programs and clinics to upskill existing officials and develop new officials was discussed within the report.				

		The committee noted that for the ongoing needs of the Jumping community, more Victorian based officials are needed to support events. The idea of shadow judging was discussed with members present agreeing that more training is required for officials.
3.1.2	JJD Licences	CR explained the initiative whereby clubs purchase the JJD software program. The JJD program FastTrack results input and allows for live scoring across events. This allows riders to see their scores within minutes of their event and will log the data on a website for the general public to view.
		CR noted that it was intended that sponsorship and marketing opportunities would be pursued for the website once more clubs moved across to the JJD Software.
		CR also indicated JV would reimburse one JJD licence per club with clubs needing to keep their receipt and send through to Equestrian Victoria.
		NVSJC representative expressed that they have used the JJD system at one of their events and have been impressed with the system.
3.1.3	Calendar Day Event	CR spoke to a calendar day currently marked for June 19 th - 20 th , 2021. It is hope that each club would have a club representative present. This meeting aims to achieve: 1) Determining the next three years of events schedule 2) Alignment of events schedule with JV strategic plan 3) Provision of a clearer path for riders in the lead up to higher level events (State titles, World Cup) Clubs would be provided with more information before the event.
3.2	Annual Financial Jumping Report	The EV CEO presented the Jumping Victoria Financial Report/Summary for the year ended 30 June 2020.
3.2.1	Strategic Levy	Member present were informed that the strategic levy is a Jumping Victoria initiative that reinvests funds from competition licences back into the Jumping Victoria strategic initiatives consistent with the strategic plan.

JUMPING VICTORIA

This year Jumping Victoria has set about further developing initiatives aligned with the Jumping Victoria Strategic Plan. The three key focus areas for improvement aligning with the Strategic Plan; (1) Supporting our people to live their equestrian dream, (2) More officials, more training, and (3) Harness the use of technology. Throughout the year, the Jumping Committee has developed initiatives to target the three focus areas while also working to improve the development of members sporting ambitions.

JUMPING VICTORIA JUNIOR AND YOUNG RIDER SQUADS

Due to the unpredictable and disrupted 2020 calendar year, all riders and coaches were rolled over for the 2021 year will only small changes to squad groups. The squad program in 2021 started positively with the first squad weekend being hosted in April at WPNEC. The squad weekend was the first since July 2020 and was a welcome return for many riders within the program.

Unfortunately, the COVID situation in Victoria returned to affect both the May and August squad weekends which were cancelled after the state entered a lockdown prior to both squad dates. Due to the unpredictable nature of COVID, neither squad was rescheduled.

Following on from last year, a review into the program led to an initiation to create a new proposal that better aligns with Jumping Victoria's strategic direction. The proposal is due to be completed later in the 2021 calendar year and be enacted for 2022. A new squads committee has been formed to follow the proposal and provide guidance to the program for future years.

JUMPING VICTORIA OFFICIALS

Jumping Victoria continued to run a range of initiatives to continue supporting the upskilling of officials as identified in the Jumping Victoria Strategic Plan. The hiring of a Workforce Education Officer in the Equestrian Victoria office has led to range of opportunities within Jumping Victoria. With no officials courses being run in 2020, there was an urgent need to conduct seminars and upskilling within the Jumping discipline. The first Jumping Judges weekend was held in July with 19 members attending across the two days. The seminar run by Kevin Taranto saw several new potential judges attend along with judges accreditation or upskilling. All attendees on the day were reimbursed a portion of their entry charge in line with the strategic initiatives developed by Jumping Victoria

Jumping Victoria is currently working with Eventing Victoria to conduct a Stewarding course in September to train new Jumping stewards for events. Along with the Stewarding course, Jumping Victoria is planning a Course Designers seminar to upskill and train new officials, this has been delayed due to inability to get presenters with state border closer.

JUMPING VICTORIA EVENTS

With the impacted 2020 calendar year, the ability to run competitions around Victoria starting in November 2020 was welcomed by all Jumping riders, clubs and officials. Despite the season starting in November, Jumping Victoria was able to support the implementation of a full events calendar leading into the State titles in May 2021. The ability for Jumping clubs to adapt to the changing times was impressive and we thank all riders for supporting clubs and attending events after the interrupted year.

JUMPING VICTORIA STRATEGIC PLAN

Jumping Victoria is committed to building and improving the services we deliver to support our membership with programs that recognise and celebrate their achievements and introduce new technology to help further the sport.

The biggest strategic initiative for 2020/21 was the 'Structuring the Sport for Success' conference held in June 2021. This conference was an opportunity for all Jumping affiliated clubs to attend together to create a set of guiding principles used to create the Jumping Event calendar for the next 18 months. Each affiliated Jumping club was asked to send a representative who worked together to create the Jumping Calendar for the next 18 months using key guiding principles.

Jumping Victoria has been supporting Jumping clubs run events over the previous 12 months with many clubs feeling the difficult of planning an event in COVID affected times. In conjunction with the Equestrian Victoria office, Jumping Victoria has hosted an event organiser meeting to discuss important aspect and provide support to Jumping clubs running events in the 2021-22 Jumping season.

Along with events, Jumping Victoria through its strategic plan is continuing to support officials providing reimbursement for members attending courses for Judging & Stewarding. The next step in the strategic plan is to work with Equestrian Victoria to run a course designers' seminar for members upskilling Jumping officials a key priority.

Jumping Victoria continued to roll out the JJD results platform initiatives by reimbursing clubs who purchased the system for use at events. Several clubs have purchased and been reimbursed over the previous 12 months. The JJD system has made results input within the Equestrian Victoria office easier to manage and allows all results to be on the same platform.

COVID-19

The COVID-19 virus has had a significant impact on the jumping community in Victoria with the 2020-21 season also impacted by cancelled events.




