Conditions of Squad Challenge Events

- Squad coaches will be available to assist with walking the course, warm up in practice arena and feedback of round with tips for improving performance.
- If riders enter the Squad Challenge on more than 1 horse, they must nominate the horse for the Challenge prior to event commencing and ride this horse as their first ride.
- The coach will still give assistance with any additional horses, however additional horses will not be eligible for placings.
- Riders must compete in the Development Squad they have been training and allocated. This is also in conjunction with consultation and feedback from the Squad coaches – as some riders have had changes in horses and they may not currently be at that level for competition.
- On Saturday afternoon there will be freshmans available in the indoor from 1pm (heights 90cm, 100cm, 110cm) you can enter these rounds via Global Entries and coaches will be on hand to give advice and feedback to riders

 great opportunity to do some training on course - indoors!

Squad tops are acceptable for all the competitions on Saturday and Sunday, however white breeches are required.

Rules & Regulations

- For Camping and Stabling please book directly with venue on http://wpnec.com.au/bookings/
- Please note a mandatory horse facility fee of \$16.00 applies per horse per day
- Eligible riders must be under 21 years to compete in under 21 years classes.
- A Young Rider is eligible until the 31st December in the year in which they turn 21.
- Open classes will be run in conjunction with the under 21 years height classes as detailed in the program.
- · Classes conducted under EA rules. Judges and Ground Jury decision is final.
- The organising committee has the right to alter the program on the day.
- As this is a Junior and Young Rider Show events are not eligible for points.
- Strathmerton Drilling Junior and Young Riders may compete in Squad uniform or competition attire (with white breeches).
- · Helmets must be compliant.
- Riders must be current members of FV or PCV
- PCV members must present with grading cards and have gear check in uniform prior to competing and not compete above their graded height.
